GREETINGS FROM THE PRESIDENT



My fellow members of ISSA,

In a book published in 2020, Japanese playwright Oriza Hirata said to young people living in the post-corona era as follows: Today's generation of Japanese people, 1) they have a conversation, but no dialogue, 2) they have sympathy, but no empathy, and 3) they have a house, but no home.

In other words, although they can talk endlessly among their closest friends, they are unable to have frank discussions with others who have different cultures and values than themselves. Therefore, although they sympathize with the weak with their own simple feelings, they are unable to recognize and respect the beliefs and values of others that are different from their

own. In addition, although they have achieved a certain degree of material wealth and a comfortable living environment, they lack a community or home where they can truly feel at ease. This means the arrival of what Atsushi Miura calls a loneliness society" "perpetual These (2022).certainly are references to the current situation in Japan, but at a time when society is undergoing rapid digitalization and polarization (division) on a global scale, don't they apply to some extent to any country? What can social studies education do in the face of such a situation? If young people in each country are unable to experience dialogue, empathy, and the beauty of home and grow as citizens who actively participate in the formation of a democratic society, the reason for the existence of social studies will disappear. I think that we, those involved in social studies education. are currently encountering such a critical situation. In this sense, not only individual social studies teachers, but also academic societies in each country have

heavy responsibility, and ISSA has a major role to play as well.

I look forward to the continued efforts and cooperation of our members to revitalize social studies.
